

Dear Collector.

I am writing this newsletter while listening to the radio broadcast of our monthly Legislative Assembly meeting. This is the main method of keeping apace with government activity so most residents keenly listen to the meetings. Our Assembly is responsi-

ble for governing the island in most areas, except defense & foreign affairs, although the Federal Government of Australia still has to approve each piece of legislation passed by the local assembly. This arrangement provides the island with considerable amount of independence, while still being part of the larger community of Australia. Our overseas customers may not know that most of Australia is experiencing a serious drought, accompanied now with widespread bushfires. Norfolk Island is also having an extended dry spell, although our plight cannot be compared to the mainland. Our main concern is whether our water tanks will hold out till rain. There is a good side to this weather - this summer has been very good for outdoor activities, with plenty of swimming, barbecues & walks.

I want to thank all who responded our questionnaire. The response was excellent. Already clear trends have emerged - one is your desire to see more issues showing Norfolk's scenery. Already I have reacted to this & our next issue will be Photographic Scenes. More detail later, but I hope you like them. I have sent out a range of small gifts to the first 100 respondents to our questionnaire.

Thirty members of Australian Philatelic Traders Association had a very successful weeklong convention here in December 2002. I was fortunate enough to be invited to sit in on the presentations, which were applicable to managing a remote philatelic office. As well, I learnt a lot about the postal stationery & classic stamp market, which as you know is quite strong at the moment. A very limited run of Special APTA Booklets was produced to commemorate the Convention being staged here on Norfolk. The whole run was bought by the APTA & then auctioned as a fund-raiser. To obtain these booklets collectors will need to contact the APTA in Melbourne.




COOK'S VOYAGE **RE-ENACTMENT ISSUE**
