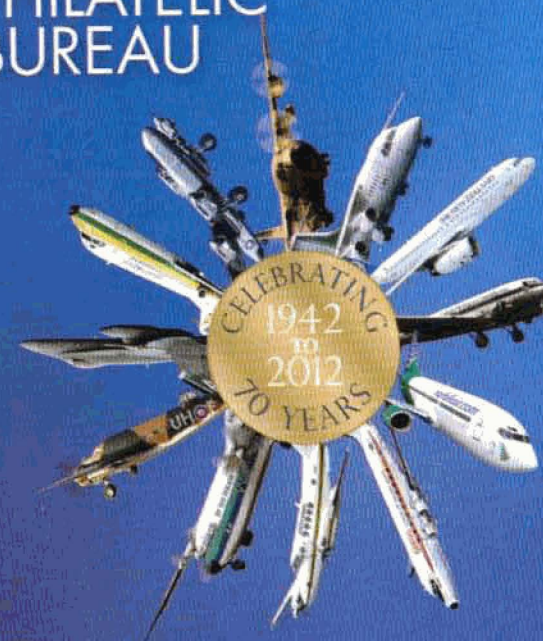

As staff members resign and leave, they are not being replaced. We are now down to 2 full-time staff members to do all things Philatelic.

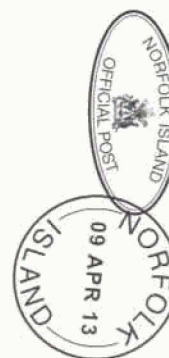
From July to December inclusive, each of us had to spend half the week away from the office. This time has come to a close and we are now working to bring everything up to date.

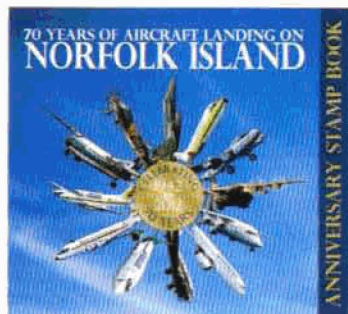
We thank you for your patience and remain committed to providing our collectors with the best service we possibly can.

70 Years of Aircraft of Landing on Norfolk Island

After its construction in 1942 by the Allied forces stationed on the island during the Second World War, Norfolk's airstrip has played an important part in our history. The airfield was used for its strategic position during the war and afterwards for passenger travel. Over the years the airfield has been widened and lengthened to accommodate modern passenger and military planes. Over its 70 year history, it has drawn crowds of residents to witness many special aircraft visits and deliveries.

RNZAF Hudson Bomber which was the first aircraft to land on the island and that happened on Christmas Day 1942. Local resident Baker McCoy who was Norfolk's Post master for many years and who also painted the artwork for the 16 aircraft stamps that were released during 1980-1981 was there to witness to that landing 70 years ago.

Douglas DC-3 which was the first regular weekly aircraft from New Zealand beginning on 2nd November, 1947.

Avro 691 Lancasterian aircraft which was introduced by QANTAS in October 1947.

DC4-Skymaster which replaced the Lancasterian aircraft which was introduced by QANTAS in October 1947.

Fokker F27 Friendship which Air New Zealand flew regularly to the island.

Beechcraft Super King Air 200 from 1976 which flew from Brisbane to Lord Howe Island to Norfolk Island.

Fokker F28-Fellowship used by East West to fly from both Sydney and Brisbane on 30th April 1983. This replaced the QANTAS flight to the island.

C-130 Hercules which has a lot of history here. It is one of largest planes operated by the RAAF and is used because of its ability to land on short runways. It has been used over the years to bring in heavy equipment to the island including the island's 2 newest fire tenders. It was also used once upon a time for emergency medical evacuations.

BAE146 was used by Jet Express commencing May 1997 to carry passengers from and to Brisbane and Sydney.

F/A - 18 Hornet Six of these RAAF supersonic fighter jets called in at the island in April 2012 to refuel. They were on their way from its 77th Squadron base at Williamtown in Australia to New Zealand.

Air New Zealand's Airbus A320 This aircraft carries passengers to and from Sydney, Brisbane and Auckland in New Zealand.

Jodie has used some of the circular carvings to coincide with Norfolk Island's new branding of "360o of Wonder", which is also a circular design, that was launched during 2012.

Church Bell, Norfolk Island

Our first 2013 issue is a \$5.00 stamp being released on 9th April, 2013 to meet with Post Office demands.

It features the bell that is situated at the All Saints Church at Kingston. There is no gutter for this issue.

The bell was made at the Russell Sydney Foundry in the 1800's. It is thought that this bell was the first bell to be used on Norfolk Island and was used at Government House to ring in each hour. There is a thought that it may have originally have been used at the Melanesian Mission which was on the island 1867 to 1920 to call the students to their meals.

To day the bell is used at the All Saints Kingston Church, which once upon a time was the Commissariat Store
