

JEW STAMP ISSUES

Seabirds Definitive - Part 2

Part 2 of the Seabirds Definitive Issue will be issued 9th August 2006. The issue will consist of another 5 stamps and a miniature sheet. Once again Roger Pennycuick has designed the stamps, just before he returned to live in New Zealand.





The birds in this set are still very common. The Wedge-tailed Shearwater visits the island in it's thousand over summer and because of its mournful call after dark, it is known as the Ghost bird. The Sooty Tern is found in large numbers on offshore Phillip Island, where females lav a single egg on the bare soil. Whenever the island is disturbed by people the birds take to the air in noisy confusion. Everybody's favourite is the White tern as it lays a single egg on a pine branch, no nest, and somehow the majority of eggs and juveniles stay put until maturity over many months of all weather. They are also a very pretty bird and inquisitively follow walkers by hovering just above their heads.

Sesqui-centenary Medallions:

The Norfolk Island Government has released 3 new medallions to commemorate the Sesqui-centenary of the arrival of the Pitcairn Community on Norfolk Island. The medallions come in 3 varieties - silver: cupro-nickel and bronze. They are same size and design, and vary only in the packaging and the metal finish

The obverse depicts the Morayshire off Kingston Jetty in 1856 with the new Islanders making their way towards their new home. The design was by Mary Butterfield. The reverse of the medallion features the Norfolk Island's Coat of Arms.

The medallions are available directly from the Norfolk Island Philatelic Bureau and are valued at:

Norfolk Island and Pitcairn Island issued a joint First Day Cover on 7 June 2006, to commemorate the 150th Anniversary of the Landing of the Pitcairn Islanders on Norfolk Island. This cover is available from both Norfolk Island Philatelic Bureau and the Pitcairn Island Bureau in New Zealand.



The 150th Anniversary of the Pitcairn Migration to Norfolk Island was a great success, with the islanders and visitors alike enjoying the day and the activities for the week.

The Re-enactment Parade through the historic Kingston area was huge. There were so many Bounty Descendants that came across to be part of the celebrations. It was so good to meet up with some of them and find out what they are doing with their lives in the "big smoke". The Governor General of Australia, his wife, and the Minister for Territories were also part of the official party. There were visitors from as far away as the USA, Canada and the UK, making the journey, primarily to be part of the celebrations.

The Bureau staff were amazed, (and shocked, I think) at the popularity of the Sesqui-centenary stamp sets and the medallions, especially released for the occasion. It has been some time since we had queues lining up for FDCs and stamps and other products from the Bureau, not only on issue day, but also the following few days.

An amazing occurrence on Bounty Day was the antics of a pod of humpback whales breaching just off the jetty for everyone in the Parade to see. This had not been seen for years. Hopefully it is a sign of more whales around.

The airport upgrading is now complete and the Island is now serviced by a new airline- OZ Jet, flying 737s based in Australia and is chartered by the Island's Government to fly 3 days per week between Brisbane, Norfolk and Sydney.
