FINAL OPPORTUNITY

STAMPISSUES


A special mention in this Bulletin must go to Mr Leo Nola who sadly passed away in April of this year. Leo's respected Norfolk Island stamp and coin business operated on the island for a number of years.

To the present and past staff of the Norfolk Island Philatelic Bureau, who have always shown such commitment and passion for their roles, since the first Norfolk Island stamp issue on 10 June 1947, the Administration of Norfolk Island passes on sincere thanks.

Norfolk Island issued stamps will not be able to be used at the Post Office on Norfolk Island from 1 July 2016, mainland Australia stamps will be used on Norfolk Island from this date. Australia Post will be releasing a Norfolk Island Stamp issue in September 2016 featuring the Masked Booby and Red-tailed Tropicbird which are both migratory ground nesting seabirds.

THE FINAL NORFOLK ISLAND STAMP ISSUE

The Norfolk Island Philatelic Bureau's final stamp issue will commemorate the 160th Anniversary of the landing of the Pitcairners on Norfolk Island. This issue will be released on 7 June 2016, a day before the Anniversary on 8 June 2016. The stamp proudly features a ledger book that John Buffett found in the store house the day he and the other Pitcairners arrived on Norfolk Island, and he used it as a diary.



Many collectors will be familiar with the history of the Pitcairners and the story of the Mutiny on the *Bounty*. Hollywood has produced at least three movies with well-known actors of the day playing Lieutenant William Bligh and lead mutineer Fletcher Christian. Those actors have included Clark Gable, Marlon Brando and Mel Gibson.

Lt. Bligh sailed from England to Tahiti in 1787 on the *HMAV Bounty* to collect breadfruit plants to feed the slaves in the West Indies. After leaving Tahiti, Bligh's harsh naval discipline and the less than desirable arrangements for the crew bred discontent. Bligh was set adrift in a longboat with 18 of his loyal men to find their way back to England, whilst Christian took charge of the *Bounty*. Through harsh conditions Christian navigated the *Bounty* back to Tahiti to allow the men to collect their former sweethearts and some Polynesian men. They searched the Pacific for an island home and in 1790 landed at remote Pitcairn Island where they made their home for 66 years, until outgrowing the small island.

On 3 May 1856, the entire inhabitants of Pitcairn Island totalling 193 persons, boarded the *Morayshire* to sail to Norfolk Island, with 194 persons landing safely at Kingston on 8 June 1856, as a child was born during the voyage.

The descendants of the Pitcairn Islanders still call Norfolk Island home to this day and celebrate 'Bounty (Anniversary) Day' each year on 8 June. The day begins on the Kingston Pier with a re-enactment of the landing, they then march to the Cenotaph and Cemetery to lay floral wreaths in tribute to their Ancestors and conclude the morning with a large luncheon and friendly competitions. A Bounty Ball is also held to celebrate the occasion.
