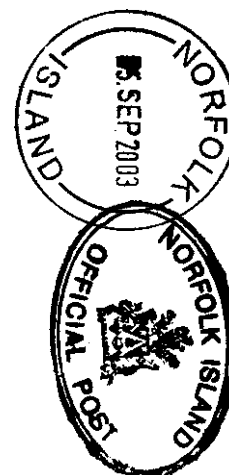

It's beautiful weather here on Norfolk lately, although we have had heavy showers and then it fines up to brilliant sunshine. So far this year we have had good rain and hopefully the dry is behind us for a while. Many readers will

know we are very dependent on rainfall as every household has its own rainwater tank. There is no town water supply.

The first Writers' and Readers' Festival held on Norfolk towards the end of July was a huge success. 16 celebrity writers participated in discussions and panels, as well as addressing the audiences. Local, but world famous celebrities, Dr Colleen McCullough and Helen Reddy, featured prominently, but some of the other writers included Richard Morecroft, Belinda Green, Robert Barrett and Richard Zachariah to name a few. The Festival attracted approximately 300 visitors who came specifically for the event.

Since our last newsletter we have recruited a new member of staff, Julie Burns, who commenced work last month as our Senior Philatelic Officer. Julie is a local, but has spent a number of years living and working in Melbourne. She is busy learning the ropes and the special requirements of our customers. Julie's background is in marketing and events management, so her experience will be valuable.

A number of humpback whale sightings around the island have been reported this year. In the 1950s and early 1960s, whales were a common sight in our waters, but like everywhere their numbers fell dramatically around 1962, so it is great to know they are returning more regularly to our waters.

I have once again had to make a change to our advertised issuing program, which you will find detailed in the technical section of this newsletter. I hope this does not affect too many people.

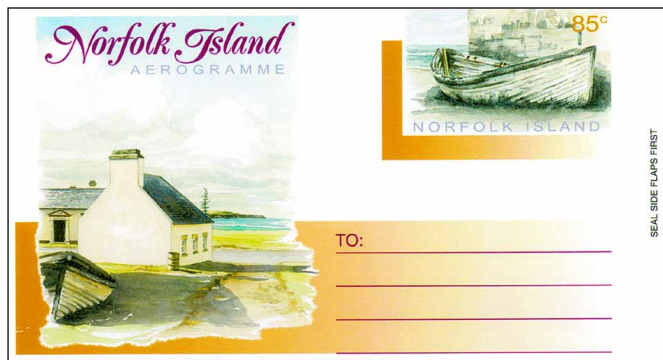

The building in the foreground is one of the oldest in Australia, with its origins dating to the very early 1800's, the first settlement on Norfolk Island. The building is now part of the Museum complex in historic Kingston.

100TH ANNIVERSARY OF POWERED FLIGHT

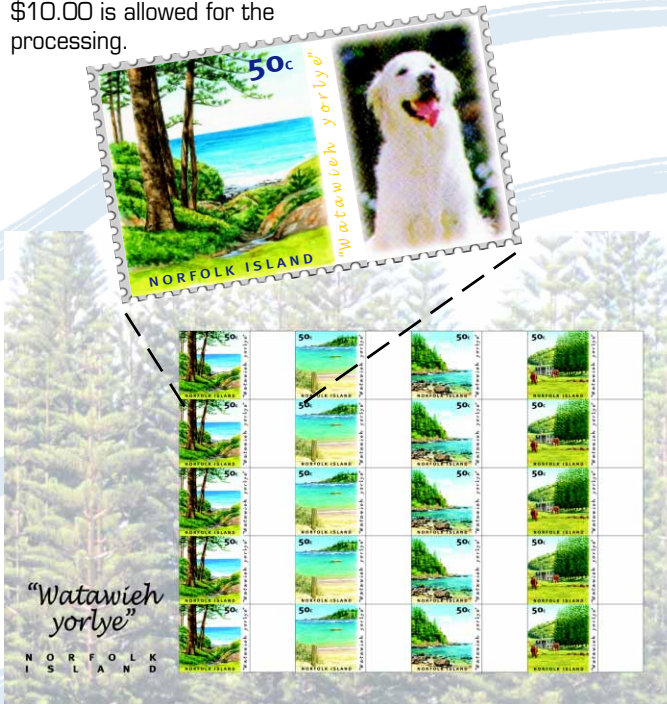
Norfolk Island will be releasing stamps commemorating the flight of the Wright Brothers in 1903. Three decades after this first flight Francis Chichester flew to Norfolk Island by float plane, and only another decade after that flight, Norfolk had an airport. Since then air travel has been our important link with the outside world. For many years the DC4 serviced the island taking 5 hours to Sydney, nowadays the 737 takes just 2 hours - to be relocated into a different world.

The sheetlet complete is valued at \$20.00

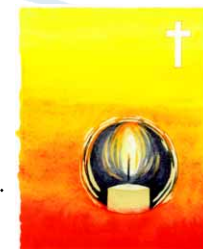


CHRISTMAS 2003 ISSUE
