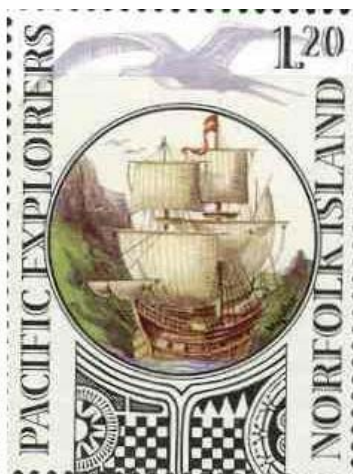
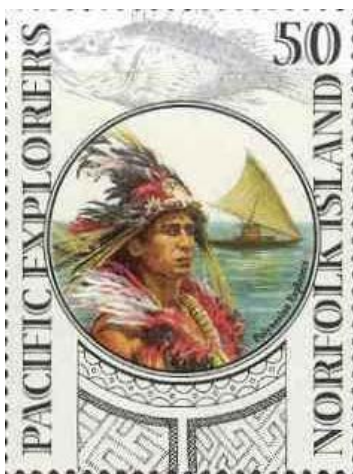
This special Issue features 4 small Items that are part of an extensive collection from the island museums in kingston.

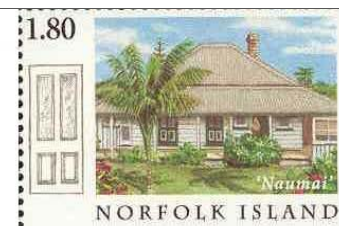
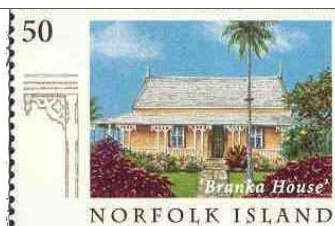
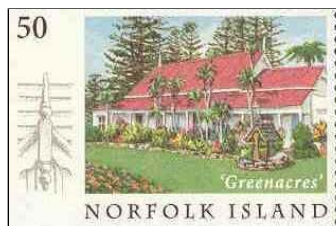

or even Ferdinand Magellan who first circumnavigated the world?

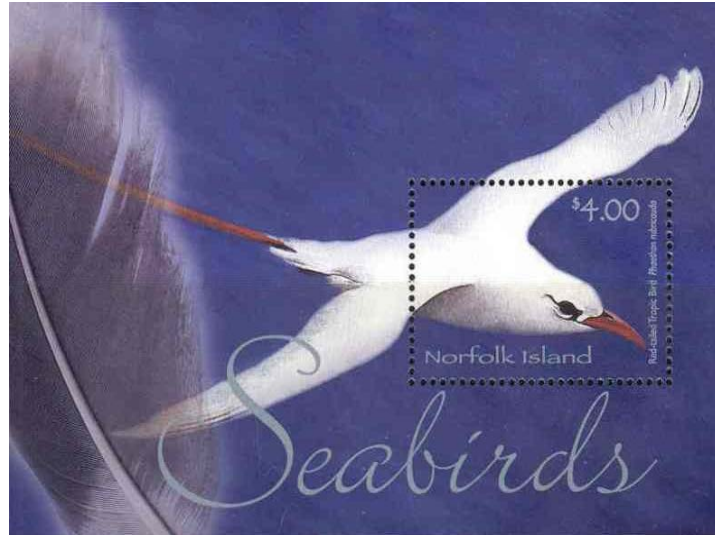
Old Island Homes



This issue highlights some of the old Island Homes which are still used today as many of the old homes have fallen into disrepair. Branka house dates from convict times and is built of convict stone while the others have convict stone recovered from Kingston Gaols during the time when the gaols were seen as an embarrassment, used in the foundations, stairs and chimneys! The traditional old Island home was a single skinned building made of wood with the internal framing visible although some old houses were beautifully lined with Knotless tongue and groove boards, depending on whether the Island was in a boom or bust cycle at the time. Many also were originally steep roofed because they were shingled. Initially architecture was influenced by convict settlement styles but later changed when tradesmen engaged in the Melanesian mission introduced different building styles to the island. The wide verandas that work so well here on the old homes originally comes from the British involvement in India, via the convict settlement houses!

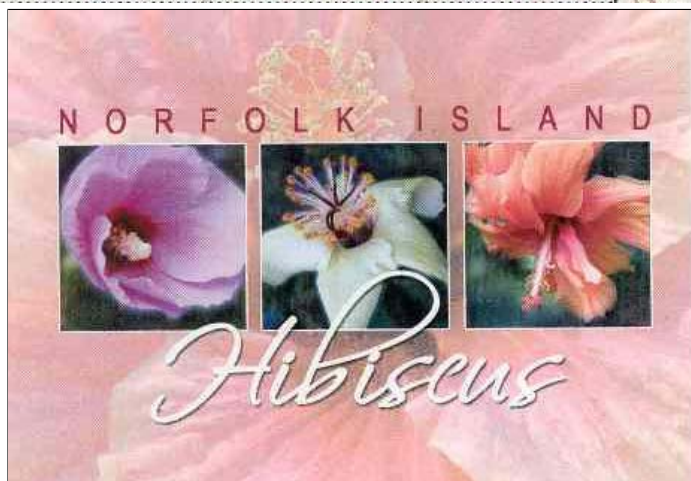
Seabird Definitive Pt.1

The seabirds from part 1 of this issue live and breed on Norfolk, its surrounding islets and ocean, some species now only nest on the outer islands because of human activity, however many still abide on the coastal cliffs and trees, while others after they fledge do not return for some years until it is their time to reproduce. most of Norfolk's coast zone is protected for this reason. The fishermen sometimes rely on the sea birds to locate schools of fish! The second part of this issue will be released in several months.
