There were no \$4.00 stamps in the Norfolk Island Stamp Stocks and \$4.00 is a denomination frequently used by the Post Office.

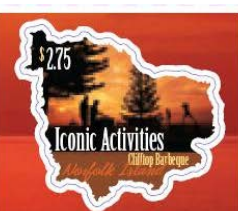

Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee

Here we have the "Celebration of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee on Norfolk Island" sheetlet. 3 x \$1.60 stamps – printed in silver foiling.

Celebrations commenced on Monday 4th June 2012, when the Administrator the Hon. Neil Pope and Mrs Jen Pope, Members of the Legislative Assembly, Students and Teachers of NI Central School, and members of the public gathered together to witness the unveiling of a new sign at Queen Elizabeth Avenue, (so named after Her Majesty's accession to the throne 60 years ago)

After Chief Minister David Buffett MLA's welcoming speech, Mrs Jen Pope unveiled the sign. In the evening a Norfolk Island Pine tree in the grounds of Government House was illuminated Red Whit and Blue lights. This beautiful Pine tee is the biggest in the world and stands at 40.7 metres tall and was planted in approximately in 1838.

Commonwealth countries had been requested to light beacons at 10pm local time on 4th June and a beacon was lit at the Queen Elizabeth Lookout, which overlooks the World Heritage Convict Site. This evening was very stormy with winds gusting up to 50 knots and sheeting rain, hence the wild look of the beacon flame which appears on the sheetlet.
